OVERVIEW


Shawbirch is located in the centre of the Borough towards the north of the market town of Wellington.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 3,239 with 6.3% of these residents from a BME background, lower than the 10.6% Borough wide.

Deprivation levels in Shawbirch are low, with the north east area in the 40-50% least deprived and the south west in the 10% least deprived of areas nationally.

The rates of households claiming housing or council tax benefits, children eligible for free school meals, children living in poverty and

households in fuel poverty are all well below Borough rates.



Educational attainment in Shawbirch is below the Borough average for Early Year Foundation Stage, with 48.6% of pupils achieving a good level of development compared to 55.1% Borough wide. Attainment at Key Stage 1 onwards is higher than Borough wide.

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour in the ward are below Borough wide across all categories, with five out of the ten ranked among the lowest ward rates in the Borough.

Satisfaction levels in Shawbirch are higher than Borough wide, in particular the percentage of people who are satisfied with the way Telford & Wrekin run things and those who agree that there area is a place where people from difference backgrounds get on well together are some of the highest ward rates across the Borough.

DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
