
OVERVIEW

St Georges ward is located towards the east of the Borough.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 6,084 with 6.5% of these residents from a BME background, lower than the 10.6% Borough wide.

Deprivation levels in the St Georges are mixed with the southern part of the ward in the 10-20% **most** deprived nationally and other areas in the 40-50% **most** deprived and 40-50% **least** deprived areas.

The proportion of households claiming housing and council tax benefits is similar to that seen Borough wide, with the percentage of children eligible for free school meals lower than the Borough average (17.4% compared to 21.3%).



Educational attainment in St Georges is above the Borough rate for all key stages with the exception of Key Stage 1 where attainment is the lowest ward rate in the Borough with just 63.5% of pupils achieving Level 2 or more in English & Maths compared to 81.2% Borough wide.

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour in the ward are lower than Borough wide across all but two categories, burglaries and vehicle crimes. The rate of vehicle crimes is the highest ward rate in the Borough at 20.2 per 1,000 population almost twice the Borough rate (10.4).

Satisfaction levels in St Georges are lower than Borough wide for three of the five measures, but 80% of residents agree that their area is a place where people from different backgrounds get on well together compared to 75% Borough wide.

DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
