OVERVIEW

The Nedge ward is located in the south east of the Borough.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 9,381 with 14.9% of these residents from a BME background, higher than the 10.6% Borough wide.

One of the six areas in The Nedge is ranked in the 10-20% **most** deprived of areas nationally, the other five areas are less deprived with one ranked in the 30-40% **least** deprived nationally.


The proportions of households claiming housing or council tax benefits, children eligible for free school meals and children living in poverty are higher than Borough wide.

The percentage of young people not in education, employment or training in The Nedge is one of the highest in the Borough at 7.5%.

Educational attainment in the ward is mixed with attainment at Key Stage 1 higher than Borough wide (87.2% compared to 81.2%) but attainment at Key Stage 4 lower than the Borough rate

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour in The Nedge are lower than Borough wide for all but two categories (total antisocial behaviour and other antisocial behaviour).

Satisfaction levels in the ward are higher than the Borough as a whole with 83% satisfied with Telford and Wrekin as place to live, compared to 77% Borough wide.
