

WOODSIDE WARD PROFILE 2013

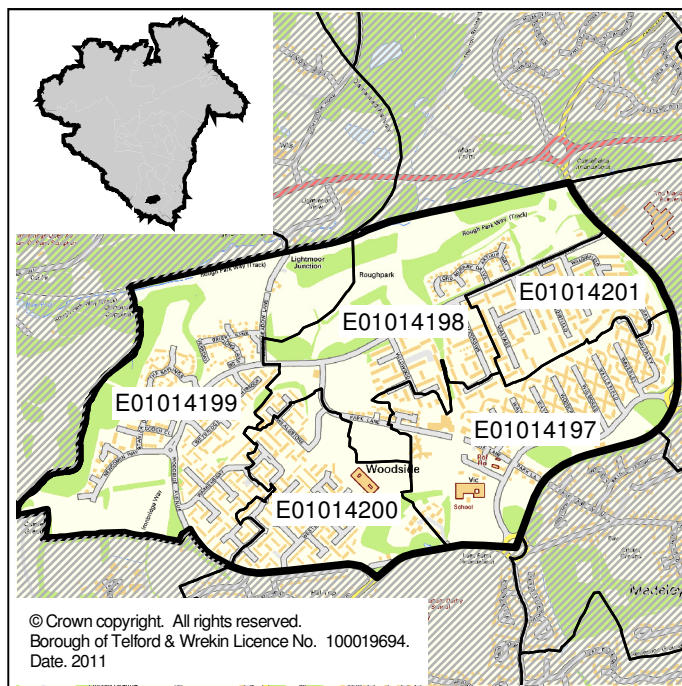
OVERVIEW

Woodside ward is located in the South of the Borough.

The 2011 Census found a total ward population of 6,898 with 6.7% of these residents from a BME background, lower than the 10.6% Borough wide.

Deprivation levels in Woodside are high with three of the five areas ranked in the 10% most deprived nationally and the other two in the 10-20% most deprived.

The ward has the highest rates across the Borough for households claiming housing or council tax benefits, children eligible for free school meals, children living in poverty and people claiming job seeks allowance.



Educational attainment in Woodside is below the Telford and Wrekin average with attainment at Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 4 some of the lowest in the Borough.

Rates of crime and antisocial behaviour (ASB) in the ward are higher than Borough wide for all but two three categories (total crime, burglaries and other acquisitive crime). The rates of criminal damage and ASB – malicious communication are among the highest in the Borough.

Satisfaction levels in Woodside are lower than average for four of the five measures, with a higher proportion of people feeling that the Council is making the area a better place to live (55%) than Borough wide (49%).

DEPRIVATION

The table below shows the levels of deprivation within the ward. Each ward is broken down into smaller areas called SOAs (see the map above) and each area is given a national deprivation rank using the following scale:
