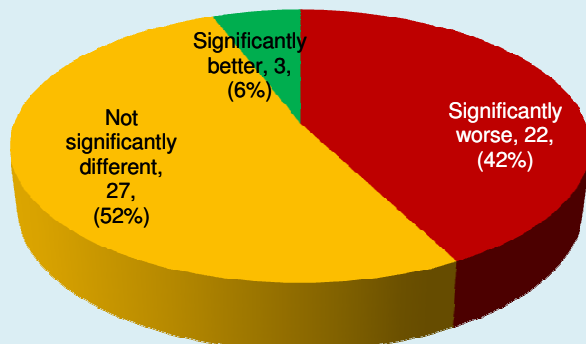


Ward Health Profile 2014: Hadley & Leegomery

Overview

- The health of people who live in Hadley & Leegomery Ward is generally worse than the average for Telford & Wrekin and England as a whole. The chart below summarises how Hadley & Leegomery compares with England in 52 Public Health England Local Health Indicators.



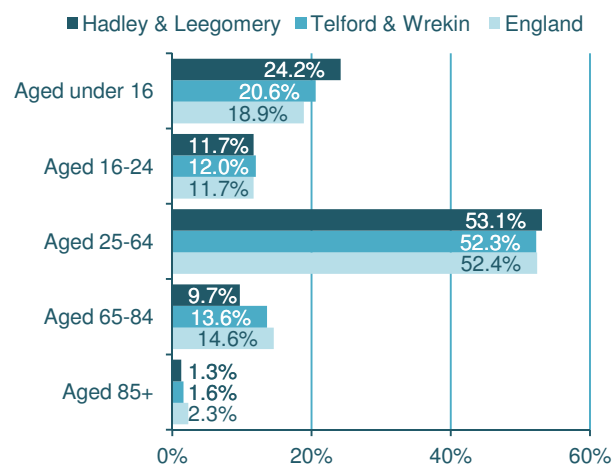

- The proportion of people aged under 16 in the ward is higher than the average for Telford & Wrekin and for England.
- Life expectancy for men is similar to the average for Telford & Wrekin. For women, it is similar to the average for England.
- Hadley & Leegomery is ranked among the more deprived wards in the borough. Levels of deprivation in the ward are significantly worse than the England average for income deprivation, child poverty and older people living in deprivation.
- The rate of emergency hospital admissions for all causes, coronary heart disease, stroke, heart attack and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease is significantly worse than the average for England.
- The rate of hospital stays for self harm is worse than the borough and England average.

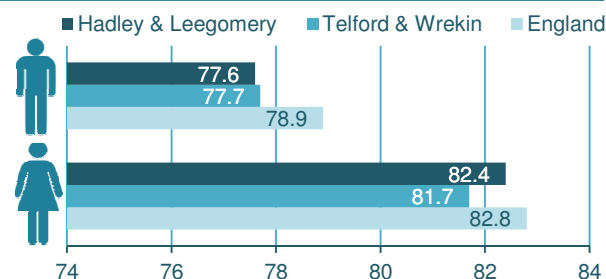


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Population age profile



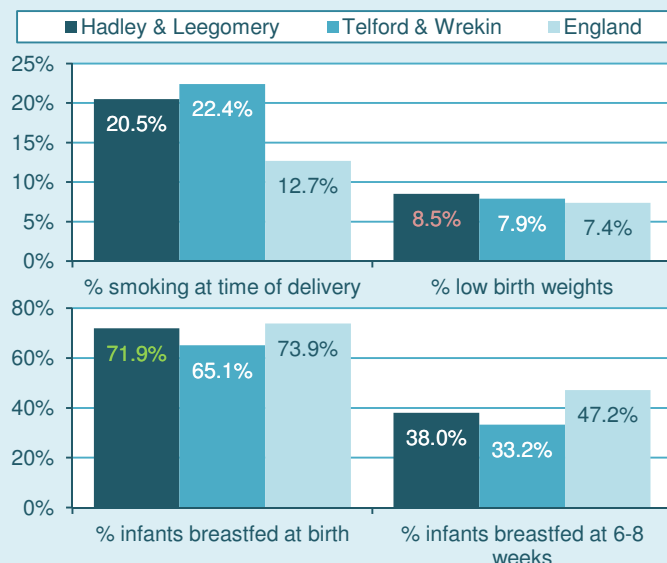

Starting Well

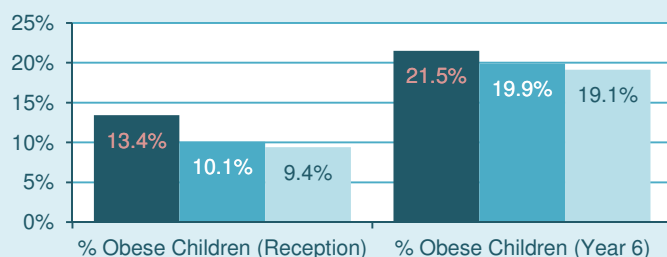
Pregnancy and Maternity

- The proportion of mothers who breastfeed their babies at birth (71.9%) is higher than the borough and similar to the England average.
- The proportion of mothers smoking at time of delivery (20.5%) and breastfeeding at birth (38.0%) is better than the borough but worse than the England average.
- The proportion of low birth weight babies (8.5%) is worse than the borough and England average.



Childhood obesity

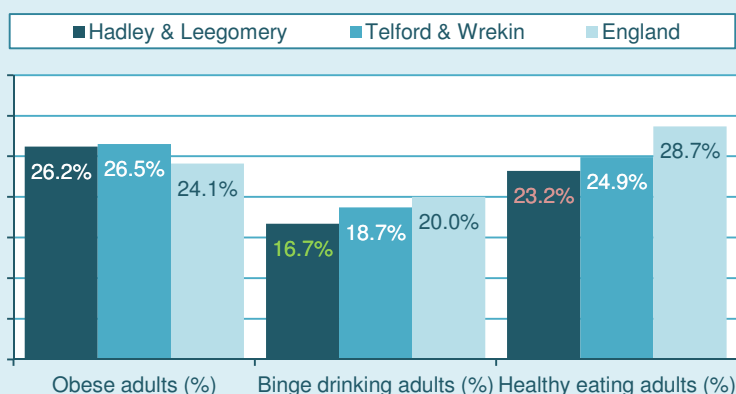
- The proportion of obese children in reception year (13.4%) and year 6 (21.5%) is worse than the borough and England average.



Living Well

Adult lifestyle

- The level of binge drinking (16.7%) is estimated to be better than the borough and England average.
- The obesity level (26.2) is estimated to be similar to the borough and worse than the England average.
- The level of healthy eating (23.2%) is estimated to be worse than the borough and England average.



Smoking cessation

- The successful quit rate for adult smokers engaged in the stop smoking programme in the 12 months since September 2013 (53%) is similar to the borough average (56%).

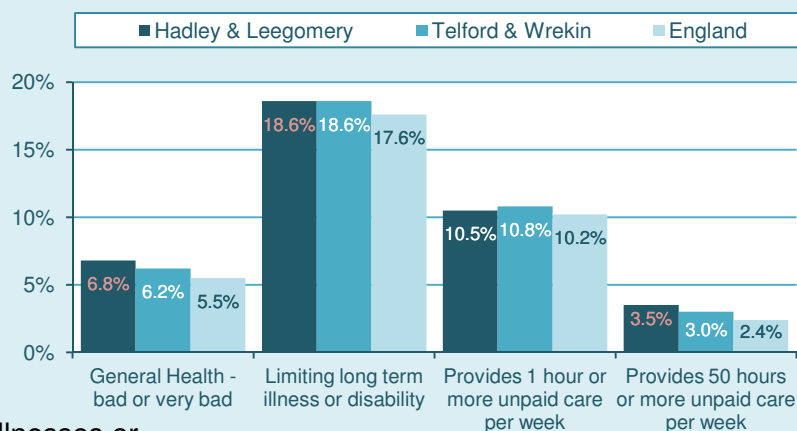

Health and Care

- The proportion of people who provide 1 hour or more unpaid care per week (10.5%) is similar to the borough and England average.
- The proportion of people reporting bad or very bad health (6.8%) and providing 50 hours or more unpaid care per week (3.5%) is worse than the borough and the England average.

The proportion reporting a long term illnesses or disability (18.6%) is similar to the borough average and worse than the England average



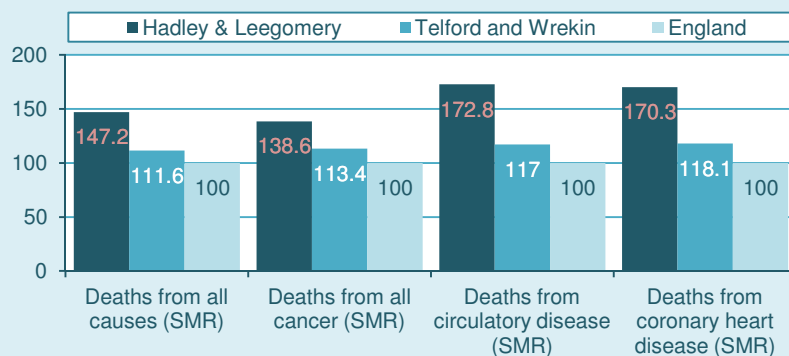
Early deaths

- The ratio of deaths among people aged under 75 in Hadley & Leegomery is worse than the borough and England average for:
 - deaths from all causes
 - deaths from all cancers
 - deaths from circulatory disease
 - deaths from heart disease

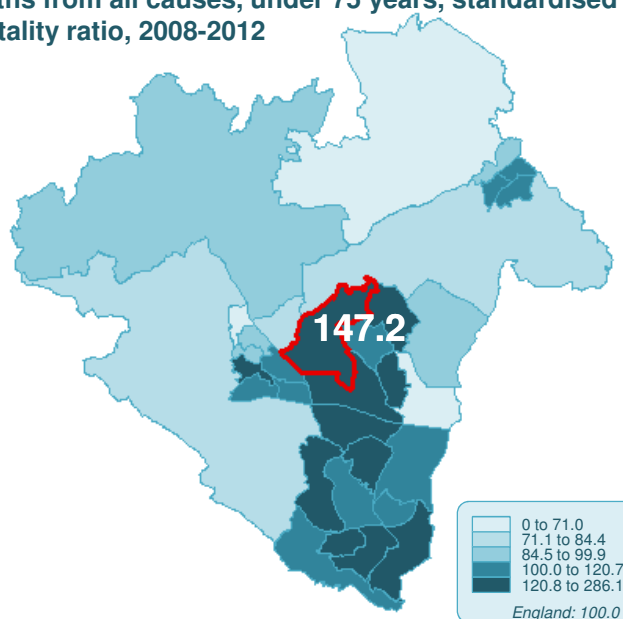
Hadley & Leegomery is ranked in the worst fifth of wards in England for early deaths from all causes.

The ratio of early deaths from all causes (147.2) is the second worst in the borough and compares with the best ward ratio in Telford & Wrekin of 60.9.

The ratio of early deaths from circulatory disease (172.8) is also the second worst rate in Telford & Wrekin.



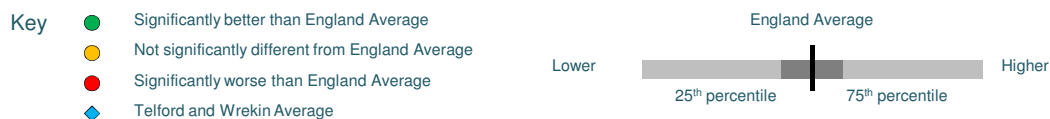
Deaths from all causes, under 75 years, standardised mortality ratio, 2008-2012
