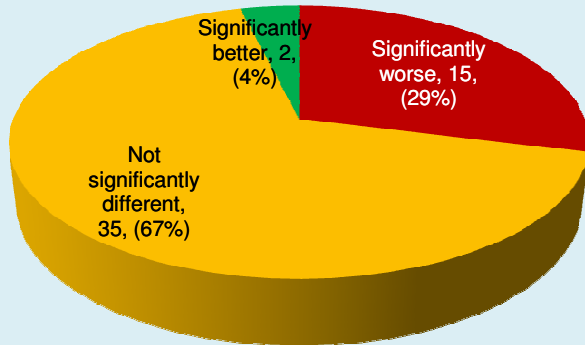


Ward Health Profile 2014: Madeley

Overview

• The health of people who live in Madeley Ward is generally worse than the average for Telford & Wrekin and England as a whole. The chart below summarises how Madeley compares with England in 52 Public Health England Local Health Indicators.



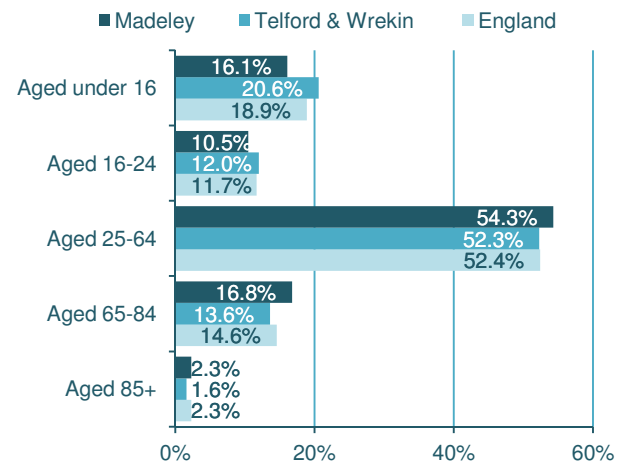

- The proportion of people aged 25-64 and 65-84 in the ward is higher than the average for Telford & Wrekin and for England.
- Life expectancy for men and women is worse than the average for Telford & Wrekin. For men, it is significantly worse than the average for England.
- Levels of deprivation in the ward are significantly worse than the average for England for income deprivation and older people in deprivation. The level of child poverty in Madeley is better than the borough and similar to England average.
- The ratio of emergency hospital admissions in Madeley is similar to the borough and England average, as is incidences of cancer.
- The ratio of Hospital stays for self harm is significantly worse than the England average and is the seventh worst ratio in the borough.

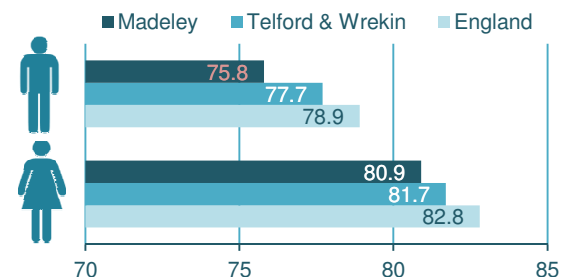


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Population age profile



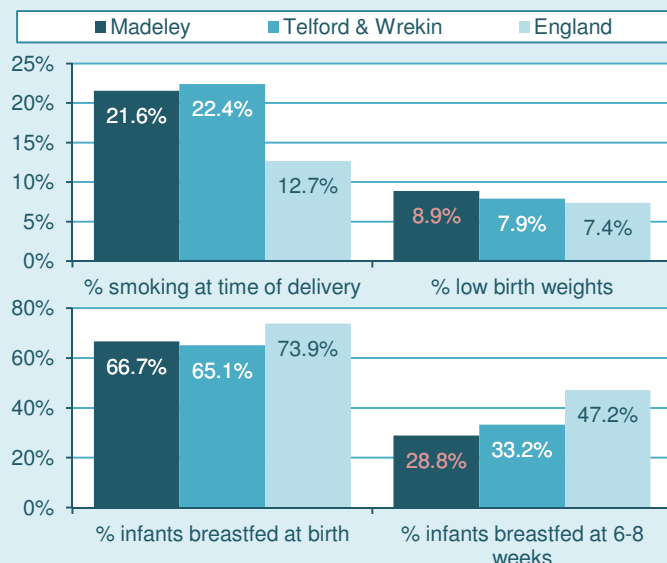

Starting Well

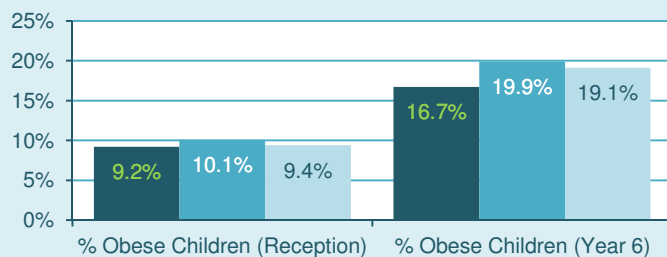
Pregnancy and Maternity

- The proportion of mothers smoking at time of delivery (21.6%) and breastfeeding at birth (66.7%) is better than the borough average but worse than the England average.
- The proportion of babies in Madeley with a low birth weight (8.9%) and mothers breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks (28.8%) is worse than the borough and England average.



Childhood obesity

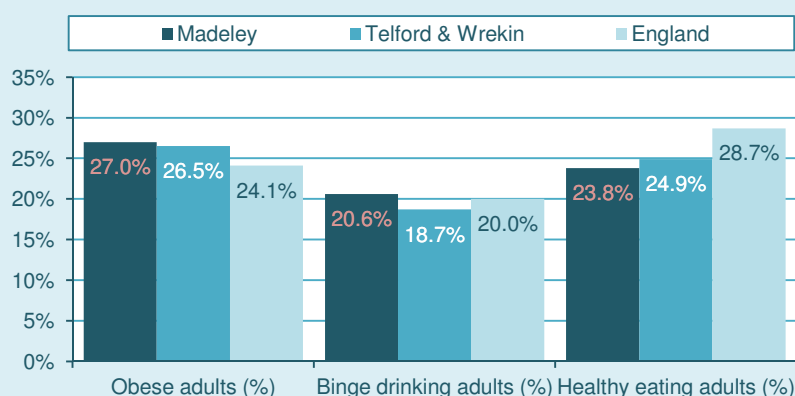
- The proportion of reception year (9.2%) and year 6 (16.7%) children in Madeley classed as obese is better than the borough and England average.



Living Well

Adult lifestyle

- The level of adult obesity (27.0%), binge drinking (20.6%) and healthy eating (23.8%) is estimated to be worse than the borough and England average.



Smoking cessation

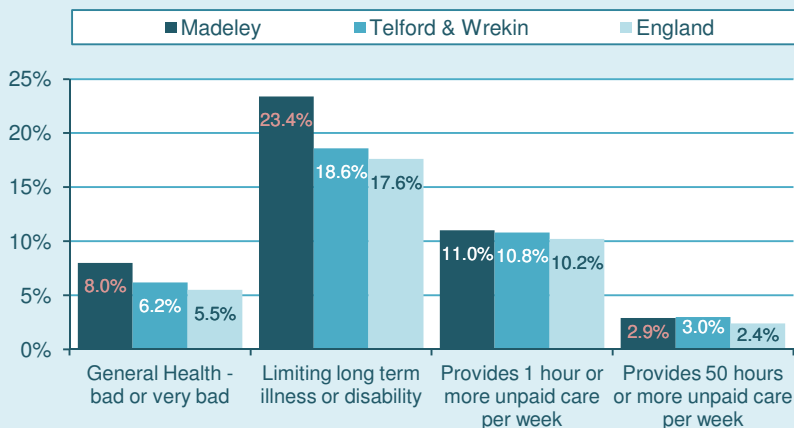
- The successful quit rate for adult smokers engaged in the stop smoking programme in the 12 months since September 2013 (60%) is better than the borough average (56%).

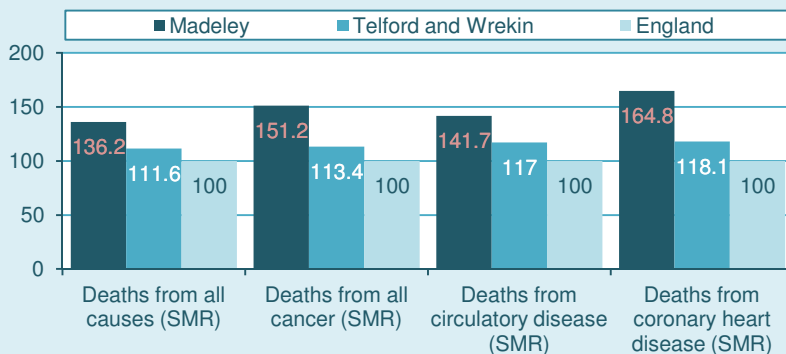
Health and Care

- The proportion of people who provide 1 hour or more unpaid care per week (11.0%) is similar to the borough and England average.
- The proportion of people reporting bad or very bad health (8.0%) and long term illnesses or disability (23.4%) is worse than the borough and England average. The proportion providing 50 hours or more care per week (2.9%) is similar to the borough and statistically worse than the England average.



Early deaths

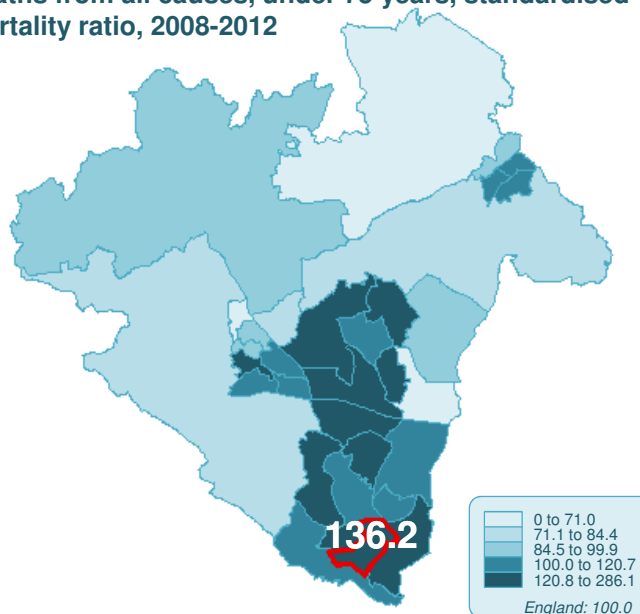
- The ratio of deaths among people aged under 75 in Madeley is worse than the borough average and the England average for:
 - deaths from all causes
 - deaths from all cancers
 - deaths from circulatory disease
 - deaths from heart disease



Madeley is ranked in the fifth of wards in England with the worst ratio of early deaths from all causes.

Madeley (136.2) has the third worst ratio of early mortality from all causes in the borough. This compares with the average early mortality ratio for Telford & Wrekin of 111.6, the best ward ratio in the borough of 60.9 and the England average of 100.

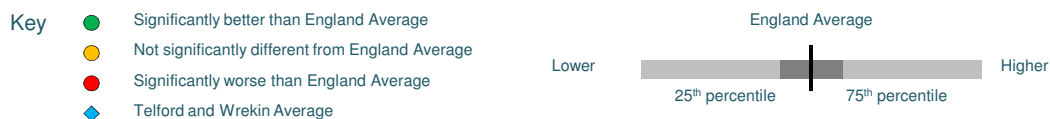
Deaths from all causes, under 75 years, standardised mortality ratio, 2008-2012
