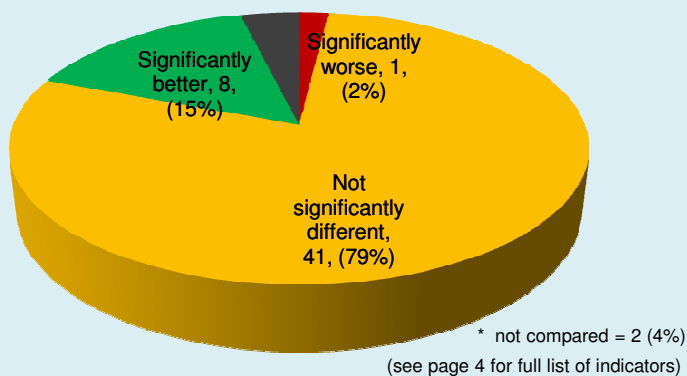


Ward Health Profile 2014: Newport West

Overview

• The health of people who live in Newport West Ward is generally better than the average for Telford & Wrekin and England as a whole. The chart below summarises how Newport West compares with England in 52 Public Health England Local Health Indicators.

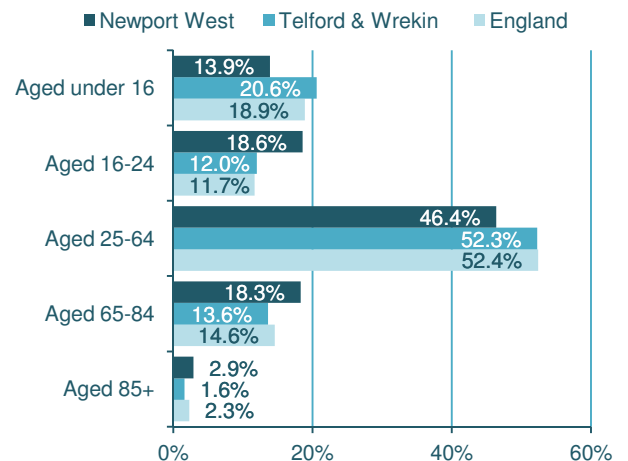


- The proportion of people aged 65-84 and 85 plus in the ward is higher than the average for Telford & Wrekin and for England.
- Life expectancy for men is similar to the borough and England average. For women, it is worse than the average for Telford & Wrekin and England.
- Newport West is one of the least deprived wards in the borough. Levels of income deprivation in the ward and the proportion of children under 16 living in poverty in are significantly better than the average for England.
- The emergency hospital admission rate is better than the England average for admissions for all causes and admissions for chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD). The admission rate for all causes is the fourth best in the borough.
- The rate of elective hospital admissions for hip replacement is worse than the England average and is the fifth worst rate in the borough.

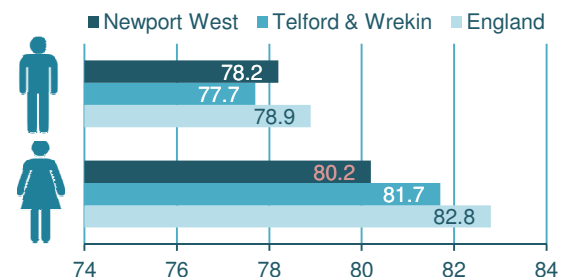

Population age profile



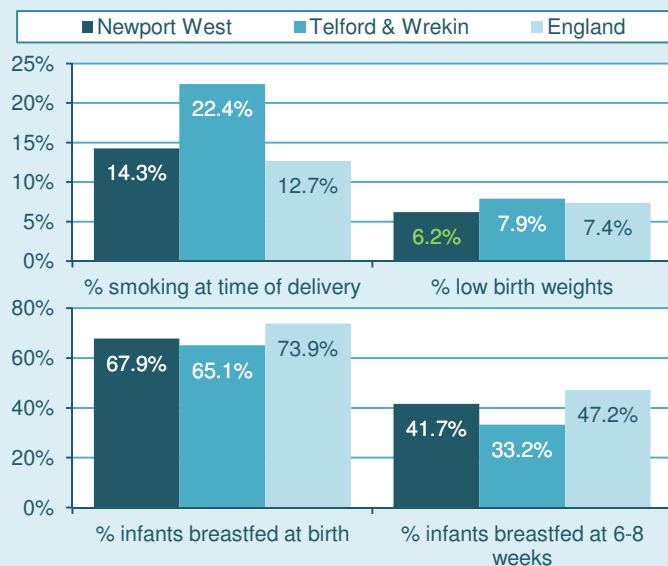

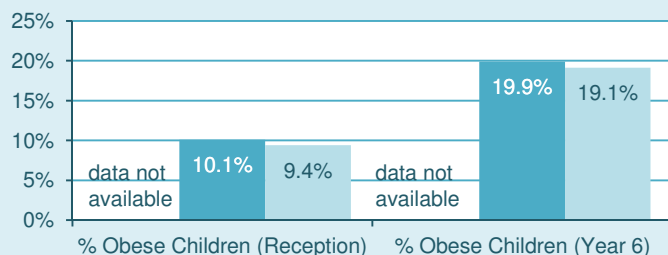
Pregnancy and Maternity

- The proportion of low birth weight babies (6.2%) is better in Newport West than the borough and England average.
- The proportion of mothers smoking at the time of delivery (14.3%), breastfeeding at birth (67.9%) and at 6-8 weeks (41.7%) is better than the borough average but worse than the England average.



Childhood obesity

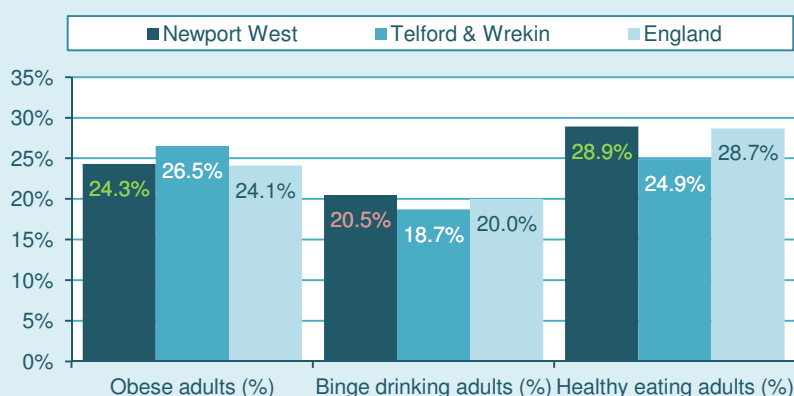

Living Well

Adult lifestyle

- The level of adult obesity (24.3%) and healthy eating (28.9%) is estimated to be better than the borough average and similar to the England average.
- The proportion of adults who binge drink (20.5%) is estimated to be worse than the borough and similar to the England average.



Smoking cessation

- The successful quit rate for adult smokers engaged in the stop smoking programme in the 12 months since September 2013 (54%) is similar to the borough average (56%).

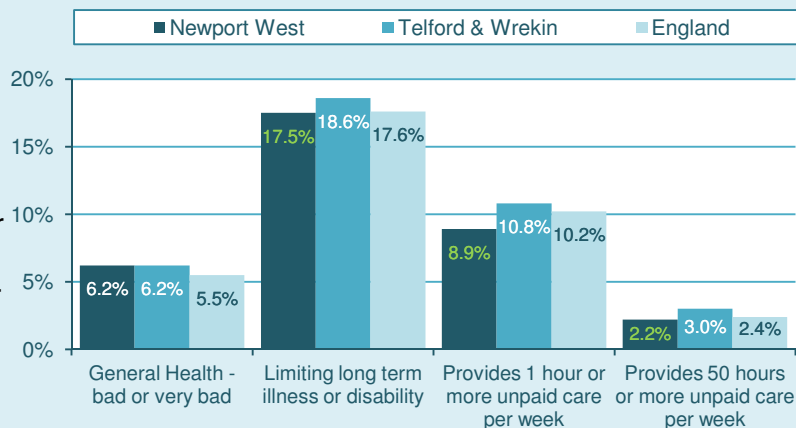


Health and Care

- The proportion of people providing 1 hour or more unpaid care per week (8.9%) is better than the borough and the England average.

Those reporting long term illnesses or disability (17.5%) and providing 50 hours or more (2.2%) unpaid care per week and is better than the borough average and similar to the England average.

- The proportion reporting bad or very bad health (6.2%) is similar to the borough and the England average.



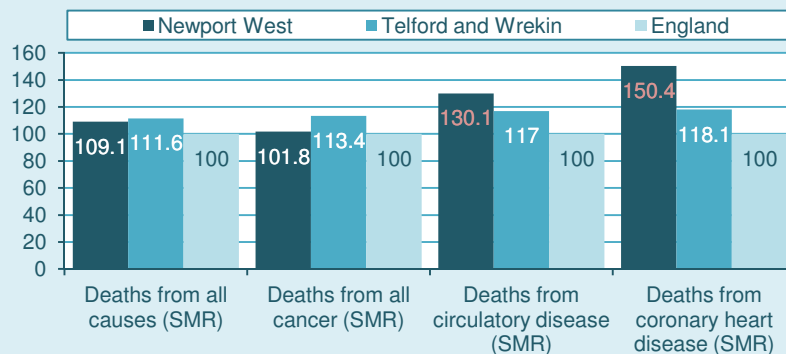
Early deaths

- The ratio of deaths from all causes and all cancers in Newport West is similar to the borough and England average.
- The ratio of early deaths from circulatory disease and coronary heart disease is worse than the borough and the England average.

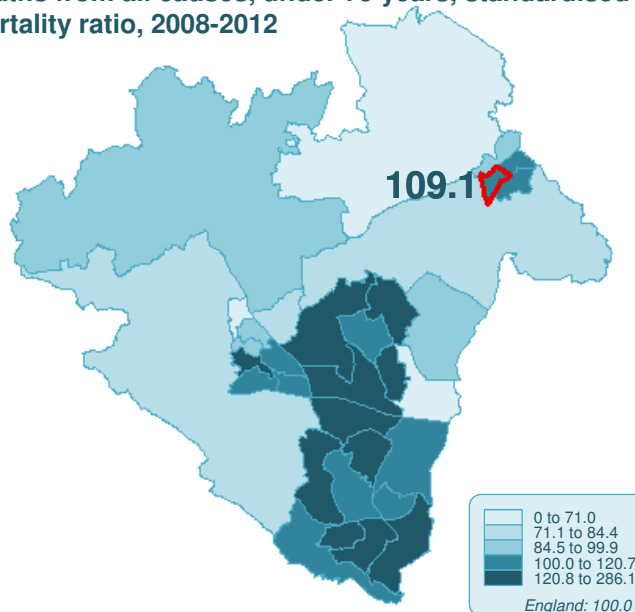
Newport West is ranked in the second worst fifth of wards in England for early deaths from all causes.

The ratio of early deaths from all causes in Newport West (109.1) is the fifteenth best out of the 33 wards in the borough and compares to the Telford & Wrekin average of 111.6 and the best ward ratio in the borough of 60.9.

The ratio of early deaths from coronary heart disease (150.4) is the tenth worst in the borough.



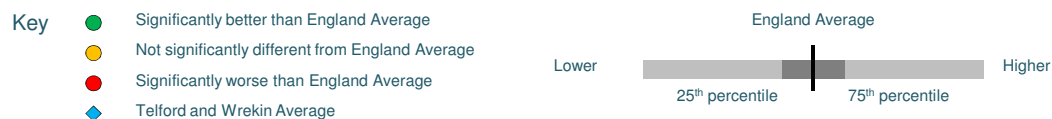
Deaths from all causes, under 75 years, standardised mortality ratio, 2008-2012
