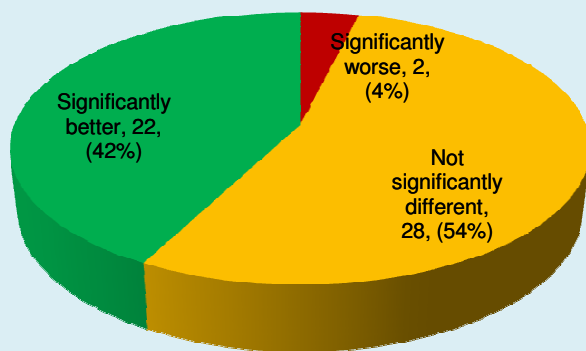


Ward Health Profile 2014: Wrockwardine

Overview

• The health of people who live in Wrockwardine Ward is generally better than the average for Telford & Wrekin and England as a whole. The chart below summarises how Wrockwardine compares with England in 52 Public Health England Local Health Indicators.

• The proportion of people aged 25-64 and 65-84 in the ward is higher than the average for Telford & Wrekin and for England.

• Life expectancy for both men and women is better than the average for England. Life expectancy for men is the second best in the borough and the fourth best for women.

• Wrockwardine is one of the least deprived wards in the borough. The level of income deprivation, child poverty and proportion of older people in deprivation in the ward is significantly better than the average for England.

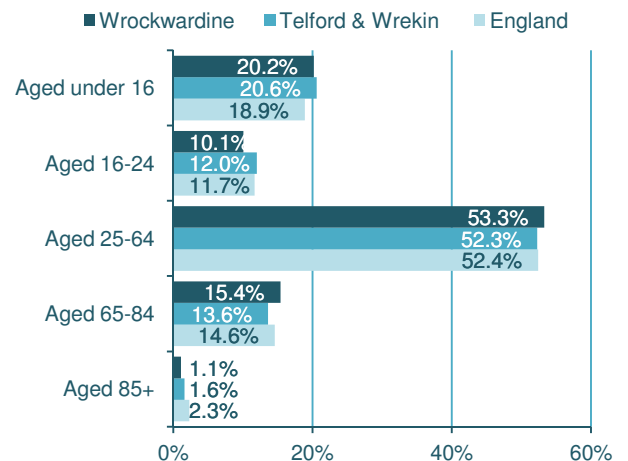
• The rate of emergency hospital admissions for all causes is significantly better than the England average. The emergency admission rate for both heart attack and stroke is also significantly better than the England average and is the lowest in the borough.

• The rate of elective hospital admissions for hip replacement in Wrockwardine is significantly worse than the average for England and is the third highest in the borough.

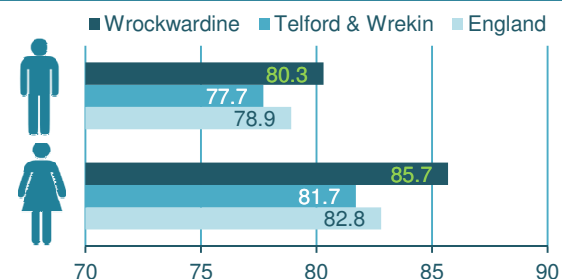


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Population age profile



Life expectancy



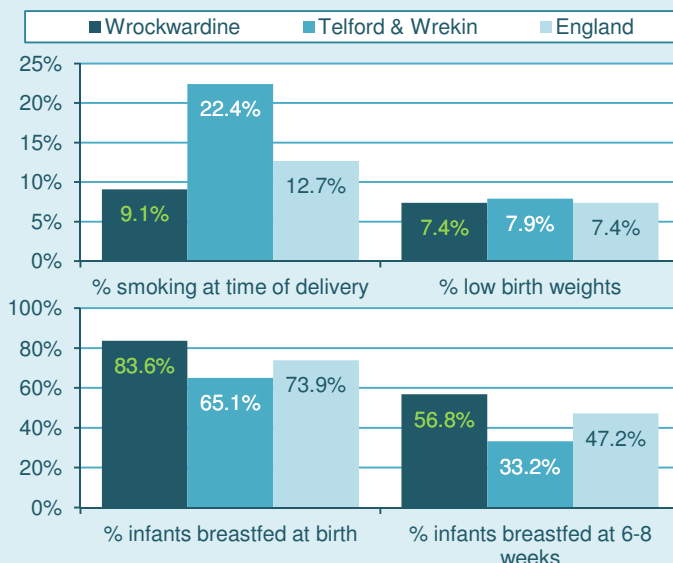
Starting Well

Pregnancy and Maternity

The proportion of mothers smoking at the time of delivery in Wrockwardine (9.1%) is better than the borough and England average.

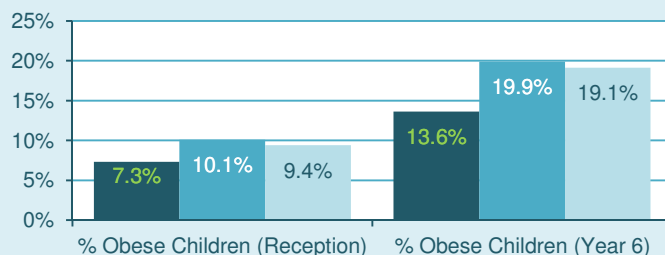
The proportion of mothers breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks (56.8%) is the best in the borough and the proportion breastfeeding at birth (83.6%) is also better than the borough and the England average.

The proportion of low birth weight babies in Wrockwardine (7.4%) is better than the borough and similar to the England average.



Childhood obesity

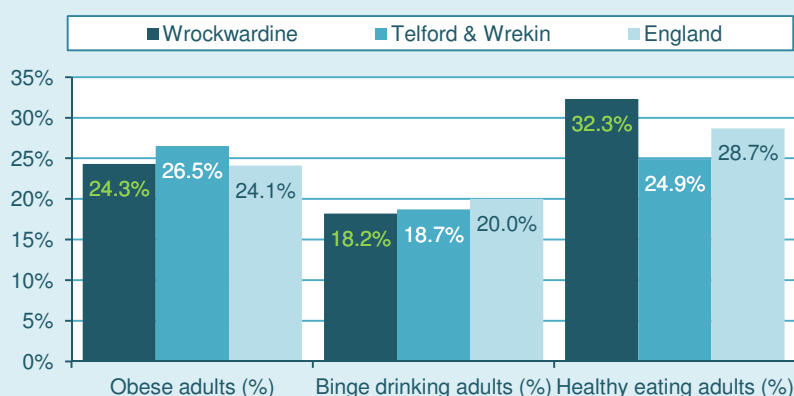
The proportion of obese children in reception year (7.3%) and year 6 (13.6%) is better than the borough and England average.



Living Well

Adult lifestyle

The level of adult obesity (24.3%), binge drinking (18.2%) and healthy eating (32.3%) in Wrockwardine is estimated to be better than the borough average and better than or similar to the England average.



Smoking cessation

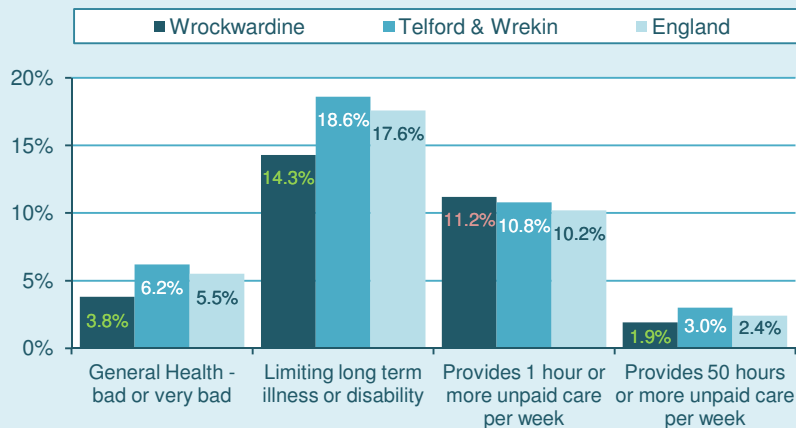
The successful quit rate for adult smokers engaged in the stop smoking programme in the 12 months since September 2013 (42%) is worse than the borough average (56%).

(42%)**



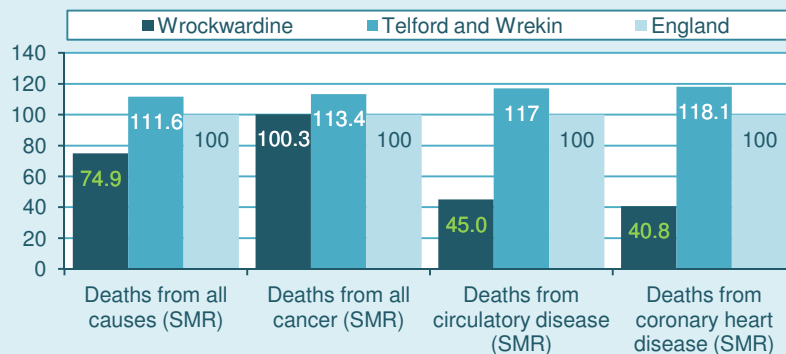
Health and Care

- The proportion of people reporting bad or very bad health (3.8%), long term illnesses or disability (14.3%) and providing 50 hours or more unpaid care per week (1.9%) is better than the borough and England average.
- The proportion of people who provide 1 hour or more unpaid care per week (11.2%) is worse than the average for the borough and England



Early deaths

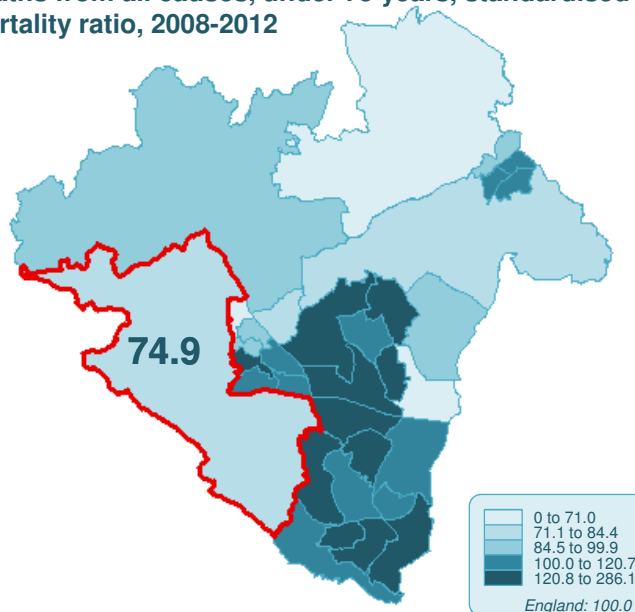
- The ratio of deaths among people aged under 75 in Wrockwardine is better than the borough and England average for:
 - deaths from all causes
 - deaths from circulatory disease
 - deaths from heart disease
- The ratio of early deaths from all cancer is better than the borough and similar to the England average.



Wrockwardine is ranked just outside the fifth of wards in England with the best ratio of early deaths from all causes. The ward ratio (74.9) is the fifth best in the borough for deaths from all causes and compares with the best ratio in the borough of 60.9.

The ratio of early deaths from circulatory disease (45.0) is the best in the borough. The ratio of early deaths from heart disease (40.8) is the second best in Telford & Wrekin.

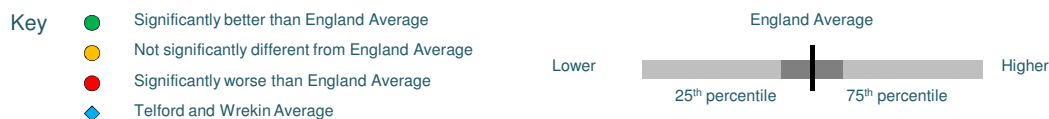
Deaths from all causes, under 75 years, standardised mortality ratio, 2008-2012
