Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2016 REGULATION 22 - NOTICE OF REVOCATION

WZ Packaging Limited (Company No.: 08541340), Halesfield 18, Halesfield, To: Telford, Shropshire, TF7 4JS

The Borough of Telford & Wrekin ("the Council"), in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Regulation 22 of the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2016, hereby gives you notice as follows:

That the entire permit issued to:

WZ Packaging Limited, Halesfield 18, Halesfield, Telford, Shropshire, TF7 4JS, on 18th May 2017 under reference 16/00016/PPCA2.

Is hereby revoked with effect from 8th August 2017 (not being less than 20 working days from the date of this notice) on the following grounds:

Operating a printing process for the production of flexible packaging for the food industry and other non-food sectors (Industrial, cosmetic etc) to which Schedule 1 Part 2 Section 6.4 A(2)(a), 6.5 B(1) and Schedule 14 of the Environmental Permitting (England & Wales) Regulations 2016 applies without the necessary emissions abatement in place as outlined within conditions; 1.2, 2.5, 2.7, 2.8 of Permit reference 16/00016/PPCA2. For the purpose of preventing or, where that is not possible, minimising, pollution in accordance with regulation 31(8)(b) of the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2016.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note does not form part of the Revocation Notice, but is for the guidance of those served with the Notice).

This Notice revokes the permit for the process specified in the Notice.

The revocation takes effect on the date given in the Notice. Anyone served with a Revocation Notice can, however, appeal to the Secretary of State for the Environment before the date the Notice comes into effect.

Appeals

Guidance on the appeal procedure and a copy of the appeal form is available at: www.gov.uk/government/publications/environmental-permit-appeal-form.

The appeal must be in the form of a written notice or letter stating that the person wishes to appeal against the Enforcement Notice. The following five items <u>must</u> be included:

- a) a statement of the grounds of appeal;
- b) a copy of any relevant permit;
- c) a copy of any relevant correspondence between the person making the appeal ("the appellant") and the Council;
- d) a copy of the Notice of Revocation which the appeal is against;
- e) a statement indicating whether the appellant wishes the appeal to be dealt with:
 - by a hearing attended by both parties and conducted by an inspector appointed by the Secretary of State; or
 - by both parties sending the Secretary of State written statements of their case (and having the opportunity to comment on one another's statements).

Appellants must also copy the above mentioned written notice or letter as well as items (a) and (e) above to Telford and Wrekin Council. Appellants should also state whether any of the information enclosed with the appeal should be considered commercially confidential (as defined in regulation 48 of the Environmental Permitting Regulations (England and Wales) 2016). Unless such information is provided, all documents submitted will be open to inspection.

An appeal will **not** suspend the effect of the notice; the notice must still be complied with.

Offences

It is an offence under Regulations 38 of the Regulations to operate a prescribed process without a permit (i.e. once a Revocation Notice takes effect). A person successfully prosecuted for this offence could be fined up to an unlimited amount and or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 12 months or both in a Magistrates Court. If the case is dealt with by a Crown Court the maximum penalty is an unlimited fine and/or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 5 years.
