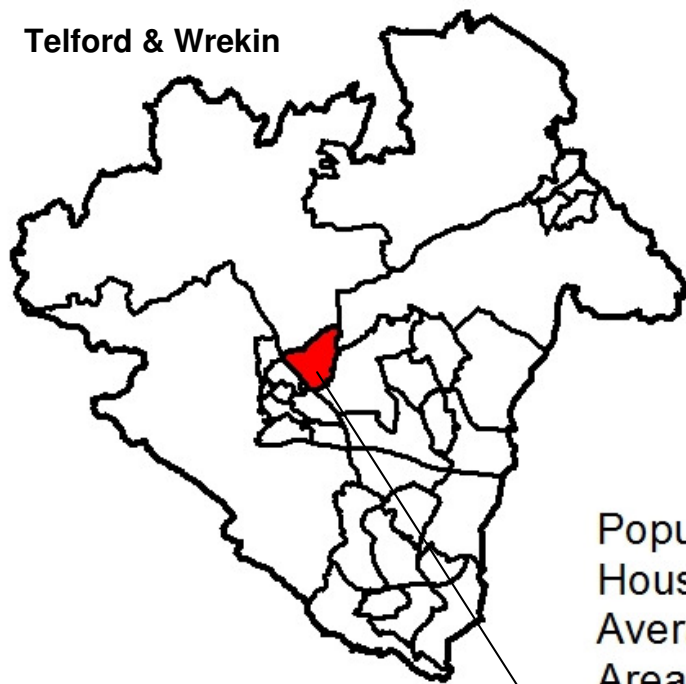
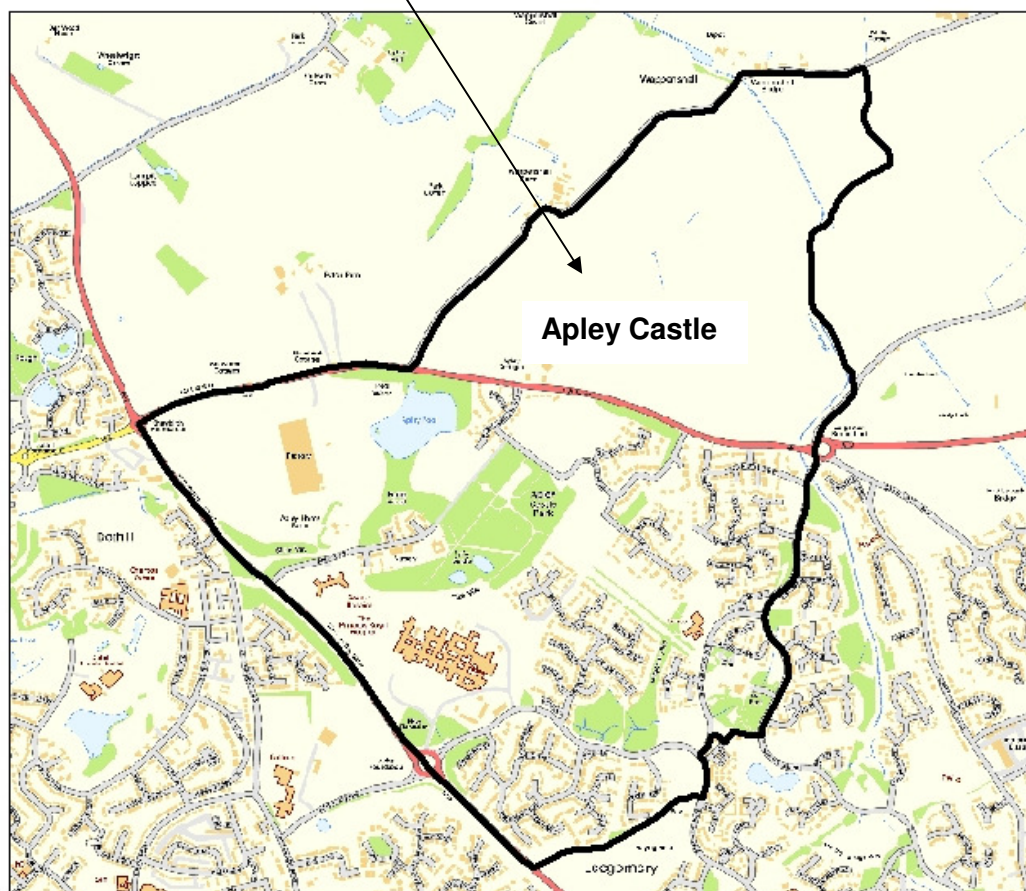

### 1 Population Characteristics

#### Summary:

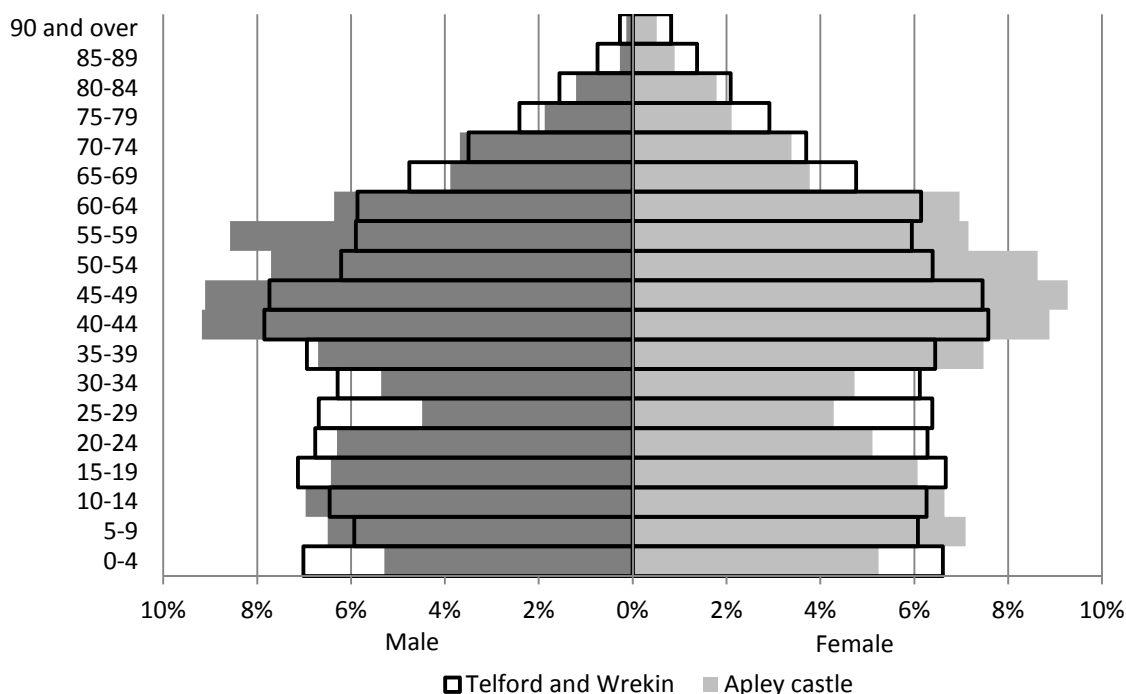
- Apley Castle's population increased by 6.2% between 2001 and 2011.
- In the ten years prior to the 2011 Census, the 0-15 age group decreased by 4.4%, with those aged 16-24 increasing by 14.4%.
- The 25-44 cohort decreased by 21.4%, with the population aged 45 and over increasing; 45-64 by 33.4% and 65+ by 58.6%.
- Apley Castle's population is dominated by the 40-59 age group, with higher proportions than Borough wide.

## 2 Diversity

### Summary:

- The BME population of Apley Castle grew by 35.6% between 2001 and 2011, accounting for 16.0% of the ward's total population, higher than Borough-wide (10.6%).
- The Asian population has increased by three quarters and at 11.4%, nearly three times the Borough figure, remains the largest BME group in the ward.
- Although the proportion of Christians decreased from 73.8% to 62.2%, it still remained the largest religious group in the ward, similar to the Borough-wide figure (61.7%). Muslim and Hindu groups have doubled in the ward since 2001.
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. Out of the 5.5% of the population whose main language is not English, the majority can speak English well or very well (4.3% of the population), above the Borough-wide rate of 3.1%.

### 3 Household and family characteristics

#### Summary:

- The 2011 Census found 1,147 occupied household spaces in Apley Castle accommodating 3,038 people, giving an average household size of 2.65 slightly higher than the Borough wide household size of 2.47.
- Less than a fifth (18.3%) of households in Apley Castle are one person households, lower than the Borough figure of 25.2%
- The predominant household type in the ward, at nearly a quarter of households (24.1%), is married couples with dependent children, although this household type has decreased since 2001.
- Some 10.0% of households do not have access to car, up from 8.9% in 2001 but still half the Borough rate. The average number of cars per household is 1.61 compared to 1.27 Borough wide.
- No households in Apley Castle were deprived across all four dimensions, with just 18 households (1.6%) deprived in three dimensions, considerably lower than the 5.9% of households Borough wide deprived in three or more dimensions.

## 4 Housing

### Summary:

- The number of household spaces in Apley Castle has increased by 43 since 2001 accounting for just 1.4% of the 3,181 growth seen Borough wide.
- The large majority of households in Apley Castle (77.5%) live in a detached house or bungalow, the highest rate of any Borough ward and more than twice the Borough figure of 30.8%.
- Nearly a third of households in Apley Castle (31.9%) own their home outright (27.2% Borough wide) with a further 51.0% of households owning their home through a loan or mortgage, considerably higher than the 36.5% in this position Borough wide. Apley Castle has the highest proportion of owner occupied households of all Borough wards (82.9%)
- A total of 20 households in Apley Castle mistakenly believe they rent their home from the Council, an increase from 13 in 2001.
- The number of households in Apley Castle privately renting their home has more than doubled since 2001 as seen Borough wide.

## 5 Employment and economy

### Summary:

- Between 2001 and 2011 the economically active population in Apley Castle decreased slightly from 77.7% to 75.4%, but remains above the Borough rate (69.4%).
- Unemployment rate in the ward increased from 1.5 % in 2001 to 3.1% in 2011.
- A total of 5.7% of Apley Castle residents aged 16-74 have never worked, below the Borough rate of 7.2%.
- The proportion of 'managers, directors and senior officials' in Apley Castle has fallen by over a third since 2001, from 20.2% to 12.5% with a corresponding increase in those employed in 'professional occupations'. Both of these occupational classes have greater proportions in the ward than Borough wide.
- More than a third of Household Reference Persons in Apley Castle (34.4%) are classed as social grade AB - higher and intermediate managerial/administrative/professional, nearly double the Borough rate of 18.0%.
- The number of people in Apley Castle who travel to work via 'train, underground, metro, light rail, tram' has more than doubled from a small base in 2001, and now at 3.1% is twice the Borough rate.
- A third (33.8%) of Apley Castle residents aged 16+ have level 4 and above qualifications, considerably higher than the 20.9% Borough wide.

## 6 Health and care

### Health and Care summary:

- Some 86.2% of people in Apley Castle reported good or very good health, compared with 80.2% Borough-wide. Just 21 people, 0.7% reported very bad health, half the Borough rate of 1.4%.
- A total of 13.8% of Apley Castle residents felt their day-to-day activities were limited by a long term health problem or disability, an increase since 2001, but still lower than the 18.6% seen across the Borough.
- Some 11.2% of residents in Apley Castle provided unpaid care, slightly higher than the 10.8% seen Borough-wide. Apley Castle has a comparatively higher proportion of residents providing low levels of unpaid care with a lower proportion than across the Borough for residents providing 20 or more hours a week of unpaid care.

## Notes and definitions

### Household deprivation

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment – Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education – No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability – Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing – The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

### Household Reference Persons

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
  - Economically active, employed, full-time, non-student
  - Economically active, employed, full-time student
  - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
  - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
  - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
  - Economically active, unemployed, student
  - Economically inactive, retired
  - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP is the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

### Dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
