

**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 BOROUGH OF TELFORD AND WREKIN NOTICE OF SPEED LIMIT PROPOSAL
TELFORD AND WREKIN COUNCIL (EDGMOND VILLAGE, VARIOUS ROADS) (30MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2018**

Notice is hereby given that Borough of Telford & Wrekin has made the above named Order under Sections 82, 83 and 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act. This Order will come into effect on Thursday 24th May. The effect of the Order is to: 1. Revoke The County Council of Salop (Restricted Roads) (No2) Order 1961 in its entirety, and 2. To introduce a speed limit of 30mph along the lengths of roads as specified in the Schedule to this Order.

Schedule – 30mph speed limit		
1.	Newport Road	From its junction with the B5062 in a south westerly direction for a distance of 668 metres.
2.	Flatt Road	From a point 302 metres southeast of its junction with the B5062 to its junction with Stackyard Lane. A distance of 297 metres.
3.	Hillside	From its junction with Stackyard Lane for a distance of 206 metres in a south easterly direction.
4.	Stackyard Lane	From a point 334 metres northwest of its junction with High Street to its junction with Flatt Road. A distance of 273 metres.
5.	Longwithy Lane	From its junction with the B5062 to its junction with Stackyard Lane. A distance of 468 metres.
6.	Marsh Road	From its junction with the B5062 in a northerly direction for a distance of 809 metres.
7.	High Street	From a point 30 metres north of the northern junction of Adeney Road and Longford Road for a distance of 124 metres in a north eastern direction.
8.	Manor Road	From its junction with High Street in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 146 metres.
