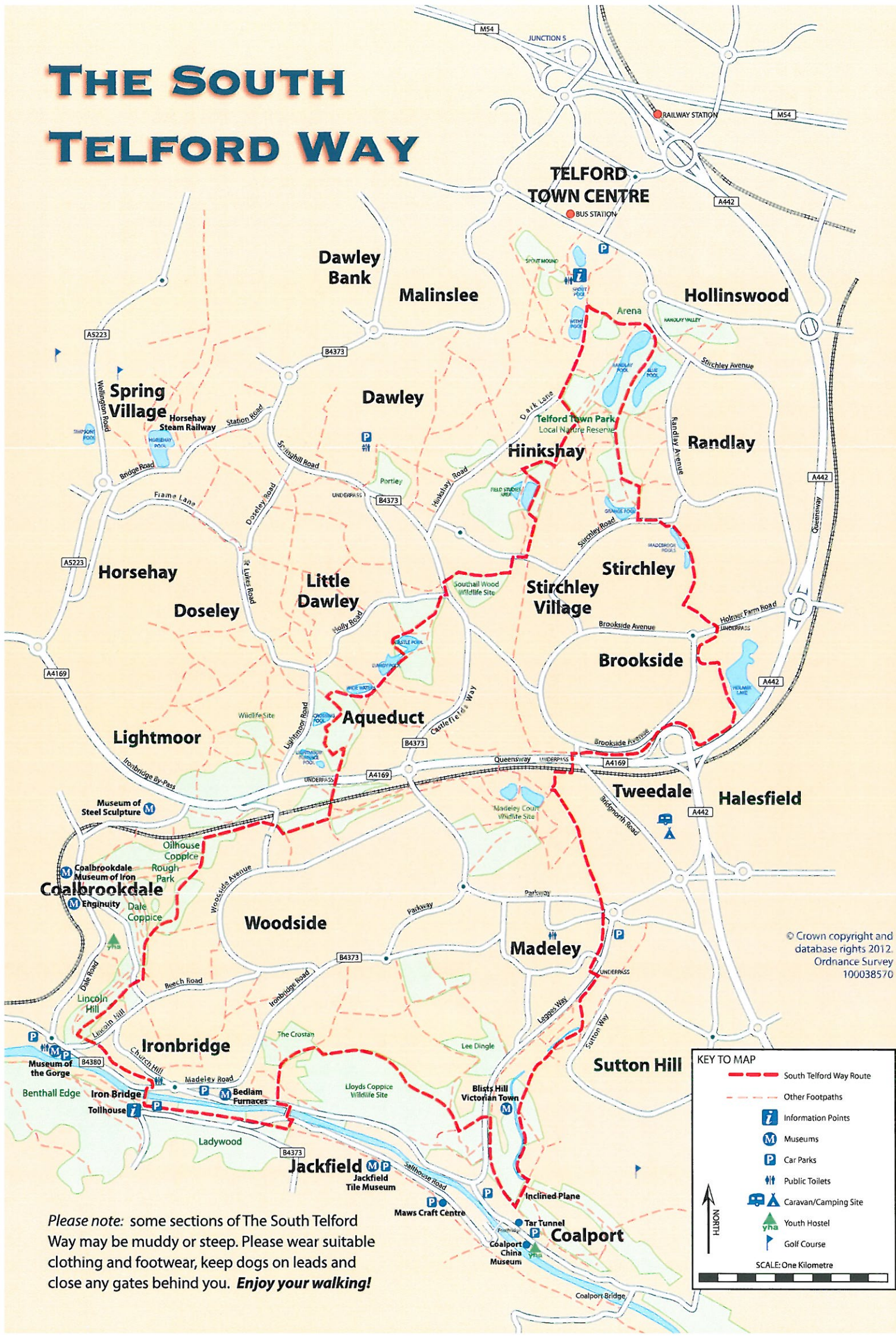


THE SOUTH TELFORD WAY



Please note: some sections of The South Telford Way may be muddy or steep. Please wear suitable clothing and footwear, keep dogs on leads and close any gates behind you. **Enjoy your walking!**

Wherever possible using the existing Rights of Way network and avoiding more heavily used footpaths, The South Telford Way presents the user with opportunities to explore new and previously 'secret' aspects of South Telford in either long or short sessions.

Discover the blend of historical and natural features that, coupled with modern development, combine to create the fascinating mosaic that is Telford today.



Look out for the green and white waymark discs on the walk –

Distance: approximately 18km/12 miles
