

Easter Egg Hunt Board Game Instructions

You will need:

A counter for each player, 1 die, pencil and paper for each player to keep a record of the number of eggs collected.

For 2 or more players.

The aim of the game is for players to collect the most red eggs.

Each time players land on a basket, information is given which allows them to work out how many red eggs there are in the basket (the probability information tells players the probability of taking a red when an egg is picked at random from the basket). If they can calculate this number correctly, they claim the red eggs from that basket to add to their total.

When players land on a space with a broken egg, they must deduct the given number of eggs from their total. This may result in a negative number of eggs at times.

All players begin with their counters on the start space and no eggs in their total. Player 1 rolls the die and moves his or her counter that many spaces, reads the information on that space and adjusts his or her egg total accordingly. Other players then take their turns, play continues in this way with players moving repeatedly around the board. The winner is the player with the highest number of eggs when it is time (as decreed by the teacher) to stop playing.
