

Key Points from discussion on Getting Out and About:

Telford Voices feedback: issues raised are:



Taxis



Bus passes - Disability is 24hr a daynot just after 9.30 am



Safety in public places



 Ladies not feeling safe with male taxi drivers.



The group say they are still nervous about going out because of Covid19 but they want to meet their friends again.



Parent/Carer feedback:



 Bus passes are an issue – not an option if going to work for 9 am or need early GP appointment





 Individual's choice when they travel – bus pass restrictions should not prevent that.



Taxis – CCTV should be available in all taxis



Parent/Carer feedback continued:



 Disability training compulsory in T&W but some taxis in T&W licensed by other local authorities. We should influence these authorities and establish best practice.



• There should be more cycle routes.



Travel training should include pedestrian training.




