## Schedule (No waiting at any time)

- Jay Drive, Leegomery (both sides) from its junction with Kingfisher Drive in a easterly direction for a distance of 16m
- Kingfisher Way, Leegomery (the east side) from its junction with Jay Drive in a southerly direction for a distance of 49m
- Kingfisher Way, Leegomery (the east side) from a point 20m south of Stonechat Close in a southerly direction for a distance
- Kingfisher Way, Leegomery (the west side) from a point 20m south of its junction with Stonechat Close in a southerly direction for a distance of 50m
- Kingfisher Way, Leegomery (the east side) from its junction with Partridge Close in a southerly direction for a distance of
- Partridge Close, Leegomery (both sides) from its junction with Kingfisher Way in a southerly direction for a distance of 19m
