PUBLIC PATH (STOPPING UP) (DIVERSION) AND DEFINITIVE
MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER
FOOTPATH 1 (PART) DIVERSION ORDER
(PARISH OF CHETWYND ASTON & WOODCOTE) 2022**

On 11 August 2022 the Authority confirmed the above Order, made on 26 May 2022 under s257 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and s53a of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. The effect of this Order as confirmed is to modify the definitive map and statement for the area by diverting the footpath from point GR SJ 75403 18140 on the plan the route being an undefined path having a width of 1 metre continues across a field in a general east-south-easterly direction for a distance of 235 metres to point GR SJ 75591 18013 on the plan then continues through a gap in the hedge and across a field to point GR SJ 75611 17942 on the plan, to point GR SJ 75403 18140 on the plan the route being an undefined path having a width of 1.5 metres continues north-north-east across the estate road for a distance of 20 metres to point GR SJ 75412 18160 on the plan then continues east as a defined pavement having a width of 1.5 metres for a distance of 300 metres to point GR SJ 75675 18140 on the plan then continues as a defined path having a width of 1.5 metres in a general south-south-westerly direction for a distance of 175 metres to a gate at point GR SJ 75625 17993 on the plan then continues as a field edge path having a width of 1.5 metres for a distance of 35 metres to point GR SJ 75611 17942 on the plan. The Borough of Telford & Wrekin Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way will be modified accordingly.

The Order became operative on 11 August 2022 by the Authority but if a person aggrieved by the Order wants to questions its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of Section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 and Section 257 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 have not been complied with, they may within 50 days of the date of publication of this Notice apply to the High Court.
