Commissioning Intentions

New Care & Support Framework

To commission a range of services for adults and young people in transition who are assessed as having either:

- Learning Disabilities
- Autism
- Mental Health
- Acquired Brain Injury
- This will include people within these cohorts with other health condition or physical disabilities

- Services will be commissioned under 4 Lots covering increasing levels of need:

Commissioning Intentions

- **Lot 1: Living Well - Community Led support** (including that delivered by partners in the Voluntary and Community Sector)
- The principles and ethos of Living Well apply whether someone has complex needs or lower level needs. This the basis of all Lots.
- We want people to be part of the community in which they live
- **Lot 2: Regulated Community Support -**
- for people with low/moderate level needs. Providers will be required to hold CQC registration for the delivery of personal care in a persons home. The service area specialism will need to be included in the registration.

Lot 3: Specialist Complex Community Support -
Support for people with high level support needs.

People supported by Lot 3 services may have complex behaviours and or health needs and / or dual diagnosis. They may present with forensic risks.

- Specialist Positive Behaviour Support
- Specialist Forensic Assessments and/or interventions
- Complex Physical Health
- Overnight support

Lot 4: Residential Services- residential and nursing
providers will be required to be registered with CQC to provide accommodation for people who require nursing or personal care. The service area specialism will need to be included in the registration. This includes Building Based Respite.
