Title	Telford & Wrekin Childcare Sufficiency Assessment (CCSA) 2025 – Summer 2025
Purpose/scope	To report on the local early years and childcare market.
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Background and Sufficiency Duties

The Childcare Act (2006) requires local authorities in England to ensure a sufficiency of childcare for working parents, parents studying or training, and for disabled children. Childcare sufficiency relates to the provision of registered childcare for children aged 0-14 years old, and up to 18 years old for disabled children and children with additional needs.

The duties in the Act (section 6) require local authorities to shape and support the development of childcare in their area in order to make it flexible, sustainable, and responsive to the needs of the community. This role is described as a market management function, supporting the sector to meet the needs of parents, children and young people, and stakeholders.

The requirement to undertake a Childcare Sufficiency Assessment (Section 11 of the Act) was repealed in the Children and Families Act (2014) however the Sufficiency Duty remains in statute. Local Authorities are required to report annually to elect council members on how they are meeting their duty to secure sufficient childcare. The annual report should demonstrate an understanding of the local early years and childcare market as a pre-requisite to ensuring, 'as far as is reasonably practicable', the childcare sufficiency duty is being met, that early years provision is being secured free of charge, and that information is available to support parents, carers, and providers.

About Telford & Wrekin



There are notable inequalities in the borough which are affecting outcomes for residents, and overall health in the borough is below average."

Families Receiving Additional Support (Talking 2's)

Families receiving certain types of additional support (FRAS) are eligible for 15 funded hours per week (term time). In Telford & Wrekin this offer is known as Talking 2's.

The Early Years team conduct outreach to contact families who are potentially eligible for Talking 2's funding, to raise awareness and to support families who may need help applying.


Some families may be eligible for Talking 2's and for Working Families funding, which may explain the decrease in take up since 2024.

Telford & Wrekin's take up rate has remained above regional and national averages. The data below is based on January statistics. Data from the most recent eligibility lists puts Summer 25 take up at 72% for the borough.

If every child with a current Working Families code this term made full use of expanded entitlement in September, this will be the equivalent of 424.5 nine month old places and 458 two year old places required.

Some of these hours will be already covered by non-funded hours with their current setting.

Families currently receiving Working Families funding pay for 7,173 additional hours (nine month olds) and 7,438 additional hours (two year olds). When their entitlement increases to 30 hours, some of these hours will transfer to funding rather than requiring a new place. The non-funded hours are the equivalent of 239 nine month old places, and 248 two year old places. Talking 2's hours have been shown for comparison but are not included in this calculation.


Whilst this does not include new applications since release, or families travelling in from other boroughs, the number of DfE codes issued suggests that we can expect around 967 funded 9 month old and one year olds, and around 1023 funded two year olds as a maximum estimate, if all of these codes were to be claimed.

Autumn term historically has the lowest take up of three and four year old funding, whereas Summer term has the highest.

Our estimated number funded three and four year olds for the 2025/26 academic year is 2827. Not all of these children will need a 30 hour place, as some will only be eligible for universal funding (15 hours per week). This total is based on the average across the academic year, so we can expect Autumn term to be lower.

As we expect there to be 3,263.5 three and four year old places in September 2025, capacity is expected to be sufficient.

Summary

9 month olds

- If every 9 month old accessing funding this term took up full entitlement next term, 849 places will be needed
- Highest growth so far is 4%, if continued, 883 30 hour places will be needed
- If every family living in Telford & Wrekin that applied for a 30 hour code took up full entitlement, 967 places will be needed
- Population estimate of funded children is 1040
- Capacity for September 2025 is currently expected to be 1094 places
- Capacity is sufficient

Two year olds

- If every two year old accessing working families funding this term took up full entitlement next term, 916 30 hours places will be needed
- The previous two terms' growth has been 18%. If this rate continues, 1081 places could be needed
- If every family living in Telford & Wrekin that applied for a 30 hour code took up full entitlement, 1023 places would be needed
- Talking 2's funded children are decreasing, although take up is still above national average
- Population estimate of funded children (all 2 year old funding) is 1350
- Capacity for September 2025 is currently expected to be 1513.5 places
- · Capacity is sufficient

Three and four year olds

- Autumn term is historically the lowest take up for three and four year olds early years places, due to four year olds starting Reception in September
- Population estimate of funded children is 2827
- Capacity for September 2025 is currently expected to be 3,263.5 places







Across each age group, the most common reason for being on a waiting list is to accommodate the family's preferred days or hours – 9% of settings raised concerns about being able to offer preferred days and hours.

15 settings identified families unable to find a place, across all EY age groups.
 Settings will be contacted to enable the EY Team to follow up directly with these families.

SEND

Settings reported 113 children with an EHCP, 187 children receiving EYIF, and 445 children identified as needing some form of additional support during the Summer term.

11 settings had to decline offering a place due to the child's support needs. Reasons included lack of space, insufficient funding, lack of available staff to provide one to one support, or lack of needed training (although in one instance the training was completed, and the child is expected to start next term).

Take up of working families funding and Talking 2's funding varies within different areas of the borough, given the contrast of economic circumstances. Newport has the highest proportion of working families funding take up, across two year olds and three and four year olds. This is particularly significant in view of the increase in working families funded hours.

In view of this, projected available places have been broken down by planning area. However, historical data does indicate movement across planning areas when comparing the family home address and the setting address.

Three and four year olds having the highest percentage may be explained by choosing school nurseries based at the family's preferred school, to prepare for starting reception.

Newport is an exception, with 92% of children aged 0 – 4 living in this area also attending a setting in Newport. This may be explained by its geographic location within the borough.

There is also movement in and out of the borough, especially with neighbouring Shropshire and Staffordshire local authorities.










Percentage of income related FSM eligible CYP accessing provision
